The AIRE Program is open any 4-H Youth, ages 11-18, looking for the opportunity to gain experience in the Application, Interview, Resume and Essay process. The application packet is due to the Macon County 4-H office by May 12th. You can pick up an application packet at the Extension office or you can download it at http://www.nc4h.org/youth/ari.

The 4-H Staff will assist you in preparing your application, resume and essay in order to go through the interview, which is the during State 4-H Congress – June 21-24. If you are selected, it could mean a trip to National 4-H Congress, National 4-H Conference or the International Leadership Conference.

If you are ages 11-13 you can take part in a non-competitive program and 4-Hers between ages 14-18 compete for awards to National 4-H trips. Even if you are under 13, it is great to start the process early so that you can be strongly competitive from ages 14-18. Please let us know if we can help you prepare for this great opportunity.

4-H Horsemanship Camp June 15 - 21

Youth who attend Horsemanship Camp will improve horsemanship skills while having fun with other 4-H'ers. A highly qualified camp staff will introduce the beginning rider to the basics of horsemanship while advanced riders can learn additional horsemanship skills and showing techniques. Special features of the camp include educational lectures, riding lessons, trail rides and training demonstrations, in addition to traditional camp activities.

Betsy Jeff Penn Residential 2 available weeks in July

Six-day camp for 8-14 Year-olds. Placed in coed activity groups according to age, campers participate in horseback riding, canoeing, archery, climbing, swimming, arts & crafts, cookouts, campfires, nature exploration, teambuilding, high ropes, and much more. Adventure programs offer older youth (12-14) opportunities to gain compass, GPS and other outdoor living skills, plus participate in rock climbing, swift water canoeing and more.

Fur, Fish N Game July 13 - 18

This is the premier summer camp experience for youth interested in the outdoors, wildlife, hunting, and fishing. Campers will have the opportunity to work with outstanding instructors from NC State University, the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission, and the North Carolina Forest Service. Classes include canoeing, riflery, archery, reptile study, snake ID, taxidermy, fishing, orienteering, and much more. Campers will also have the opportunity to earn their hunter safety certification.
